Jam the Dinosaur

Last Friday Reception had an exciting visit from a very life-like dinosaur called Jam. The team at Teach Rex taught the children that T-Rexes were predators and moved like flightless birds. The children were fascinated and asked lots of interesting questions.





On Friday, as an exciting end to our topic, Year 2 had the opportunity to be like Chris Bonington on The Old Man of Hoy and become real life climbers. After harnessing up, the children attempted to scale the 25 foot climbing wall. They all had a go and were incredibly brave!

Healthy Snacks

Earrings

Stockport's Public Health Strategic Lead sent the following communication to schools in March regarding jewellery:

All personal effects including jewellery must be removed for PE lessons and activities
If items cannot be removed, staff need to take action to try to make the situation safe. In most cases, this may mean adjusting the activity in some way. All jewellery, including earrings, must always be removed before a pupil engages in competitive activity. Taping is not suitable in any activity where contact (with either another person or equipment) is highly likely to, or will, occur.

With this in mind, to ensure children can engage in all activities, and in line with our School Uniform Policy, jewellery is not suitable for children in school (religious items should not breach health and safety regulations). Thank you for your support with this.

Roblox

We are increasingly hearing children chatting about playing on Roblox. Please note that the game is age 13+. There is a public forum on Roblox where children could potentially be exposed to people they do not know. Personal belongings

It is great to see so many children cycling and using a scooter to travel to school. I have also seen many children with Fitbits. Please remember to label personal belongings with your child's name, this avoids mix ups with items that are potentially identical. Parents are welcome to lock scooters and bikes at the scooter park. If an item is precious or expensive, please consider carefully before sending it into school. Children become very upset if items are misplaced, especially if the item is unnamed as it may not find its way back to them.

Playground Safety

Recently I have seen two young children being knocked over by children scooting across the playground at high speed. Please can parents ensure that children are not riding their bikes or scooters on school grounds, instead they should be pushed to the scooter park.

The playground is a very busy place at the end of the school day. For safety reasons, children should not play on the playground equipment after school, enter the forest or climb the trees on school grounds. This includes children who walk around from the Junior School. Elm Cottage cannot utilise

the playground for afterschool club until they are able to lock the gate. With this in mind, please can parents collect children promptly at the end of the school day. Thank you for your support with this.
