Building Works


School has been extremely busy over the holidays. Our 7 projects began on July 26^{th} and are still being completed.

We have:

- replaced the heating system.
- began work to install a new fire alarm system which will be completed in October half term.
- changed the staffroom into a classroom which is now class 9. This has included installing new toilets for the children, sink area, new flooring and the installation of IT equipment. The change will allow all Reception classes to access the outdoor provision.
- Reconfigured class 9 so we now have a PPA/meeting room, staffroom and SENCO room. This has included stripping back the room, installing three new walls, a kitchen, redecoration and new flooring.
- Installed a digital lunchtime system ready for our new provider Dolce.
- Extended and upgraded the Reception outdoor provision which has involved installing a fence, canopy and redesigning and installing lots of additional equipment.
- Installed a fence around our forest school area this is to ensure the health and safety of our children.

It really does feel like a new school and I am sure everyone can appreciate how much time and hard work this takes from all the team. Mrs Prescott has spent time over the holidays moving classrooms in order that it is ready for the children, she even persuaded her family to help, and Mrs Crawshaw has prepared the new SENCO room. We have had over 20 workmen in over the holidays and up until the end of last week school still looked like a building site. Every room had was impacted by the works which not only takes focussed project management, but also causes lots of disruption and mess! All the team including teachers and teaching assistants came in to help get school ready for the new academic year, and we have filled two skips! I am so grateful to everyone for their dedication to school and their support in being ready for the children.

Our hero has been Mr Jones who has worked tirelessly to ensure the work is completed. He has given up almost his entire summer and dedicated his time to school. He has worked over and above what is expected, including weekends. We cannot thank him enough and we feel extremely privileged to have such a skilled and dedicated caretaker. The Hursthead Infant Family really pulled together to make our vision a reality in just 5 weeks.

Next Steps

School sends home, at regular intervals, individualised "Next Steps" for all pupils in literacy, maths and the thematic work undertaken in each year group. These will inform you of particular areas of learning that will benefit your child.

Seesaw

Teachers use a computer app called "Seesaw" to communicate with you, give you more details about our curriculum and to issue homework. The system is currently being updated so that your child is linked to their new class and we hope that this will be completed by the end of next week. Your child will then bring home their new log-in information - please keep this in a safe place as the log-in will be the same throughout the year on all devices. Please ensure that you log out of your child's previous Seesaw account before entering the new log-in information in order to see your child's new class. All year groups will be passing on to you an overview of the work that your child will be completing this year.

Birthday Assembly

This year we are going to celebrate birthdays in class and teachers will ensure children receive a certificate on their special day. Whilst parents will not be able to attend the in-class celebrations, there are many more opportunities for parents to visit school, starting with the Reception meetings and the Year 1 and 2 welcome night in September, a face to face parent consultation in March, three open afternoons throughout the year, and a parent invite to our Mini-Olympics.

Celebratory Award

Over the year pupils may be awarded with the weekly 'Headteacher Award' badges. These badges are awarded to pupils for being helpful, kind or looking after others. They are also awarded if the class teacher has noticed a pupil particularly behaving like one of our 'learning characters'. As a reminder I have listed these characters and their learning characteristics below and I would encourage parents to talk about these at home as regularly as you can over the summer.

Nasal Flu Vaccinations

We have been informed that Intra Health will be coming into school on Friday 10 November to administer the nasal flu vaccination. Further information and consent forms will be given closer to the time.

Curriculum Additions

Each week, each class will enjoy an "activity time". During this time pupils will engage in either a French lesson with Mme Coutts, a sporting activity with a qualified sports coach or a music/ukulele lesson. The sessions will last for an afternoon or a morning, and each class will rotate on a half termly basis around the three activities. We feel this initiative brings greater breadth and creativity, plus a lot of fun and enjoyment, to the curriculum we offer our pupils. Year 2 will be enjoying their activity time on a Tuesday afternoon, Reception on a Wednesday morning and Year 1 on a Wednesday afternoon. In addition, Years 1 & 2 will enjoy during the academic year a 6 week block of Forest School.

Asthma Inhalers/Medical Needs

If your child uses an asthma inhaler, even on an occasional basis, could we please ask that you leave a spare inhaler in school together with details of dosage and frequency required. Please ensure that this is brought into school in its original named box. A member of staff will contact parents if an inhaler has been administered during the school day and a note will be put in the child's book bag. If your child has specific medical needs or during the course of the year develops a medical condition, please ensure school is made fully aware.

Nut Free Zone

We remain a nut free zone. Please ensure that children do not bring any food containing nuts into school. If children do bring food containing nuts, a member of staff will hold on to it until the end of the day and return to parents.

Parking

Parking around both schools is a genuine safety concern at drop off and collection times. Please can everyone park with consideration for each other, the school's neighbours and the safety of the school community. The estate around the school is large and we would encourage parents, who need to drive, to park away from the school and walk the short distance to the school playground. I have attached information from the Council for your information.

Open Afternoons

Each term class books will be sent home so you can see the fantastic work and progress your child has made. We will also hold open afternoons at the end of each term where you will be able to visit your child's classroom. Further information will be sent out before the first open afternoon.

Water Bottles

At Hursthead Infant School we feel very strongly that every child should have access to water throughout the day. We operate a water availability scheme and all children are encouraged to bring a filled water bottle (water only please), labelled with their name, into school daily. Please ensure, for organisational and spillage reasons, that the bottle is kept separate from lunch boxes and reading bags. The water bottles can be 'topped up' and re-filled during the school day. We do like to maintain uniformity hence each child is given their first water bottle by the school. Replacements can be purchased from the school office for the bargain price of £1.50 or 50p for the lid only!

PE Kit for Gymnastics and Outdoor Games

I would like to take this opportunity to remind you of the P.E kit your child will need to keep in school. Each individual item of clothing should be labelled with your child's name.

- Plain T- shirt, round necked white
- Black shorts with narrow legs (please note that dance leggings that reach the back of the knee are not suitable for gymnastics as they are too long.)
- Jogging bottoms these can be any colour and are just needed to keep pupils warm for outdoor games
- Warm Sweatshirt again any colour
- A pair of trainers velcro fastening is appreciated
- Short socks if tights are being worn!
- Hair bobble (as appropriate)

Jewellery in PE lessons

Following advice given by Stockport Council, with regard to the safety of pupils in school, we request that pupils do not wear jewellery, including earnings. We realise this may cause difficulty for pupils who have recently had their ears pierced; please do approach the class teacher if this is the case. We respectfully ask parents to have pupils' ears pierced during the summer holidays to help with this policy.

Absences

We request parents to contact school by telephone or email on the <u>first day of their child's absence</u> so that school is fully informed of the whereabouts of all pupils on roll. If your child is likely to be absent for a longer period please keep the school office fully informed. This information is legally required in order for the absence not to be recorded as 'unauthorised'.

Child Safety

In the interests of keeping our school and children as safe as possible we would request your help in adhering to the following matters:

Please use the Infant playground entrance at the start and end of the school day.

- Please do accompany your child across the road and into the school grounds.
- Please do not bring dogs into the school playground. There is a Health and Safety issue raised when
 dogs foul in the playground and some of our children are very frightened of dogs.
- Please park appropriately. In the interests of the safety of all children we ask you not to park on the yellow zig-zag lines or partly on the pavements at the start or the end of the school day. Please make sure that accessibility to people's properties for residents, deliveries and the emergency services is maintained at all times.

Lost Property

Lost property can be found inside the door of Reception's side entrance of school. If your child loses an item please check the labelled containers. Could we again request that all items of clothing, lunch boxes etc are clearly marked or labelled so that they can be reunited with the children. At the end of each half term unmarked items from lost property will be donated to charity. Thank you for your assistance.

School Uniform

During the school year uniform, including school book bags, can be purchased from Zenith Childrenswear by completing an order form online www.zenithchildrenswear.co.uk. Orders are delivered to school by Zenith and dispatched via your child.

Pupil Premium

Eligible Pupil Premium funding is an allocated amount of money paid directly to schools. The funding supports the teaching, learning and well-being of pupils who are eligible. Pupils who can access this funding can either be:

- Free School Meals
- A Looked After Child in the care of the Local Authority
- Children adopted from care on or after 30th December 2005 (even if for only one day)
- Children who left care under a Special Guardianship Order (SGO) on or after 30th December 2005 and
- Children who left care under a Residency Order (RO) on or after 14th October 1991

If any family has a child who meets the above criteria, please can you inform myself or the school office in order for school to claim the funding. We do fully appreciate that this information is confidential.
