Inhalers

Stockport respiratory team advise that children should not be in school if they require 4 puffs of their Salbutamol inhaler every 4 hours at any time. Parents are advised to keep children off school and see the GP if symptoms are not settling down at home.

Medication

The School Nurse Team advise that any medication administered by school, including Calpol, needs to be labelled by the Pharmacist with the child's name. You can ask at the Pharmacy for a printed label for Calpol without a prescription.

A huge thank you to our hard working PSA who have organised so many wonderful events on the lead up to Christmas. Without your hard work and dedication, we would not be able to provide all the opportunities we do for our children. I know most of our members are very busy working parents, so it is very much appreciated that you take the time to support school in a way that makes such a difference.
