ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduate Degree

Applicants should hold a minimum of 2:2 honours degree from a UK university, or a qualification recognised as equivalent.

A-levels

All selected candidates will have equivalent to two A levels at grade C or above in preferred subjects.

GCSEs

All selected candidates must have attained a standard in English, mathematics and science which is equivalent to the standard required to achieve a grade C (4) in GCSE examination. Equivalency tests are accepted. Applicants should also possess GCSE grade C (4) in at least 3 other preferred subjects.

HOW WE SELECT OUR TRAINEES

Application Form

We will assess the application forms along with the University of Manchester using the criteria outlined. We aim to notify you of our decision within 40 working days of receiving your application and interviews will be held at regular intervals throughout the year.

School Based tasks

You will be invited into an alliance school to undertake a short task with a group of students. You will be provided with information about the nature of this task in order to prepare appropriately. We will use this task to assess interaction with students; ability to enthuse, engage and communicate well with children. There will also be a presentation task and a formal interview. (On the day, there will be identity and qualification checks – please provide photographic ID, proof of address and copies of your academic qualifications.)
